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2021 Survey Introduction

Guide to Interpretation of the Report and Terms

The next few pages provide overall data about ministers' demographics, salaries, benefits, and allowances, as well as information about the churches represented in the survey. Following the summary, the report includes details on specific ministry roles, illuminating overall trends and relevant granular details.

Key Terms

- As a guide, this report presents *averages* and *percentages*.
- The designation n/a is used when a category was reported but had insufficient data.
- *N* indicates number of people.
- *Allowance* means the annual dollar amount of church-paid items such as housing, books, travel to meetings, local mileage, and cell phone.
- Benefit is the annual dollar amount the church pays for health, dental/vision, and retirement.
- *Master's* indicates all master's degrees other than the Master of Divinity (MDiv).
- *Doctorate* indicates all doctoral degrees other than the Doctor of Ministry (DMin).

Details About the Survey and Data

This national survey was conducted January 10-March 19, 2021, and reports 2021 salaries, benefits, allowances, and other data for ministers in Churches of Christ.

The final survey size of 371 resulted in a margin of error \pm 4.9%, which means any one percentage could be higher or lower by this margin related to probability rules of randomness among survey respondents.

Throughout the report, if a category is omitted from a table, chart, or other section, it is because no survey respondents were in that category.

Additional Analysis on Preaching Roles

Church Size by Education by Salary Range: Preaching, Senior/Lead, Solo Ministers

The three preaching minister categories (Preaching, Senior/Lead, and Solo) were further sorted by church size, education, and salary range.

For church size, the median (or midpoint of this survey's distribution of church size) is 180, which served as a comparison cut point. Thus, the data are sorted according to church sizes less than 180 compared to church sizes greater than or equal to 180.

For salary, the data was further sorted into percentiles in order to view a more granular (or more detailed) salary range. The values represent the highest salary in each of the four percentiles. For instance, within the overall Solo Ministers 25th percentile (or the lowest 25%, or the bottom one-fourth of salaries), the highest salary is \$41,350.





Impacts of COVID-19

Respondents submitted a total of 737 open-ended comments in response to the question, "In a few key phrases, how has COVID-19 impacted your church's attendance, activity, giving, or your ministry?"

These responses are grouped into three headings with samples of typical responses, which have been edited only minimally for clarity. Due to space limitations, not all responses are included. As readers can see, many comments are topically intertwined.

Attendance and Giving (33% of Total Comments)

These integrated observations reveal common trends (with some interesting and notable exceptions): a decrease in face-to-face attendance from 10%-70% (with several 100% currently), increase in online attendance, holding relatively steady in giving (with some variance), and looking for new pathways.

- We are down about 20% in attendance with suspension of most extra activities and ministries. We still meet for Sunday morning class/worship, Sunday/Wednesday evening, and Tuesday class devotional.
- Attendance is up slightly with online viewers, but down 50% in person. Giving is up about 5%, less ministry volunteers and more load on staff.
- In person attendance is 20-30%, overall attendance down even with generously evaluated online numbers, but giving is almost the same as pre-Covid.
- Attendance down, Sunday morning worship only, classes online for Sunday and Wednesday evenings.
- It did not significantly affect our attendance and contribution.
- Fewer attending. More outside (Parking Lot via FM Transmitter) than inside. Members left permanently. Contribution Down. Less contact. No visiting.
- Attendance declined slightly, giving down 10%, but we have new visitors. My ministry roughly the same.
- In person attendance down by half, families with children aged 0-11 isolating, families w/ teens not isolating, giving has held close to normal.
- We're still largely in a shut-down mode as it relates to in-person activity. Our people are
 engaged online, and we have "added" many from beyond Gallup to our virtual audience.
 Giving has kept up with expenses, which have become minimal (beyond salary).
- Attendance down; had to limit classes to outdoor or online. People have lost energy and some have left (we were closed when others were open).
- Attendance is down when only online is offered. We have more midweek small group type settings (online) now than before, but total attendance is down. Food bank ministry has continued with significant procedural changes to accommodate virus precautions. Outreach ministries mostly stalled.
- Our attendance in person dropped significantly as things have ebbed and flowed. My
 area of ministry took on a lot of extra duties due to the technology and broadcast needs.
 Our giving has remained strong and we averaged more in giving than our 2020 Budget
 called for.

- Attendance is down 40% but is steadily increasing. Support groups suffered. Giving has remained strong.
- Cut salary because of the COVID impact.
- Worried about money rather than people even though we exceeded our budget significantly!
- We met our yearly budget, so we have more money because many ministries are stagnant as they wait for activities to begin again. In person is at about 40% which is causing some angst about the future.
- Giving is up, expenses are down. Attendance at 55% of normal. Communications Ministry more active.
- Our giving has remained; however, our attendance has significantly decreased in the adult worship, teens, and nursery to toddler areas. Most adults are worshipping online or not at all right now. Giving has not dropped. Attendance is half. Ministry was curtailed, lots of safety precautions.

Changes in Activities (40% of Total Comments)

Activities were significantly altered, including visitation, reaching out, Sunday evening and Wednesday services, and related weekly activities, with several notable frustrations and hopes.

- About a third have been attending, a third we know are probably staying online for now, and a third are hard to track. We met our budget last year. Most events have been cancelled. We're hopeful for 2021.
- More members online than in person still. More time on my part connecting with members, finding alternative forms of teaching/mentoring/ministry. Young adults more difficult due to restrictions.
- We have become very flexible with programming and thinking through safety and logistics, but continue to provide opportunities for people to gather and connect as well as children to bond. We are strategizing new ideas for small groups since most are not meeting in person.
- Much less activity. Giving has been pretty steady. Attendance is down, but largely as a function of membership. Many moved through the year as COVID shook up their life, opened possibilities.
- Did not meet for 6 months. Now only Sunday AM worship. Attendance at that service is down with no out of town visitors. Giving has dropped but not as much as would have expected. Mostly older congregation who are retired so income not affected as much by COVID as true of younger members.
- Giving the same, attendance dropped dramatically. My ministry is now completely remote, as is our whole church for now. We expect at least a 20-30% attendance drop when things return to normal.
- Attendance is 28% of normal, no events/fellowships/retreats, giving steady. We fear we'll lose people.
- In-person attendance is 50%, but online presence has increased; some ministries cut back or stopped, others have changed; offering has only decreased slightly; my inperson ministry has decreased significantly, but still teaching, preaching to smaller groups and online.

- Giving has slightly increased. Attendance has declined. Fellowship activities greatly reduced. My ministry has become much more focused on a few specific opportunities as well as more directed to individuals.
- 60% still watch from home, no church activities, fellowship meals, parties, Wednesday night class, nor small groups. Giving is the same. My youth ministry has been turned upside down (no activities, only a 20 minute class once a week on Sundays).
- We meet live, but 2/3 of church members only attend online. Giving is constant. Activity is directed by COVID. My ministry role has morphed into a Tech Support role, since we never before had online.
- Giving is up, attendance/activities down. Growth: new people attending, lots members/visitors online.
- At least a 90% increase in online attendance and about a 66% decrease in house attendance; contribution shows a 15-20% increase; Overall ministry activities down about 50%.
- 70% now online, 30% in person. But of 70%, we don't know if we have lost several???
- Families are no longer participating online or in person. The only kids attending inperson worship are staff kids. Feeling very unnecessary.
- Our church is continuing to meet predominantly online. We are offering in person services with a 25% capacity, but see only 10-12% worship in person with us. We have a strong online presence because of our membership worshipping online. Our giving has slowed but is close to pre-pandemic levels.
- Killed it. Attendance decreased. Activity decreased. Giving decreased. Tough to do visitations with COVID, so study time has increased but visitations have decreased.
- 90% shift to digital attendance, limited extra-worship activity. I've had to become a videographer and streaming professional.

Effects on Ministry (27% of Total Comments)

The following sampling of comments reflects attitudes, morale, ministers' outlooks, despair and uncertainty, as well as reimagining and hope for the church's future.

- I'm too exhausted to even type it all out.
- In person attendance cut in half. Not a lot of self-starting ministry within the congregation --- all minister led. Giving is down by 1/4 but the "need" for online giving will benefit the church in the future.
- With so many devices, my ministry has turned into parent pastoral support in equipping more than anything else and a whole lot of porch visits to the families that represent 13 cities.
- Attendance is hard to assess. Activity has disappeared except for online and some limited visitation. My ministry is more stressful because I've had to learn new skills and radically adjust to a new schedule.
- Much less attendance, slightly less giving, forced (for the better) us to reshape and rethink our ministry.
- My ministry is shut down; decreased, challenging, flexibility needed.
- We closed in-person for months. More attending online than in person. Forced leadership to consider the future of what "church" can look like.

- More creative, flexible in doing ministry, worship; pastoral care using new technology; stronger now.
- It has significantly impacted us, but the polarization has impacted us more, having to choose a side on mask wearing or not, on political affiliation (unfortunately), on racial and social justice issues, etc.
- Virtually shut it down and divided between masks and no masks.
- Learned many new technologies, upgraded streaming, giving remained steady as expense went down. We lost some folks but have gained more. Our church has been resilient and I'd easily say we have thrived considering the horrible circumstances. Worst thing has been not being able to grieve the deaths together of some long time members. For my job personally, 2020 was (and it's not even close) the busiest year I've ever had working. Most of the online presence fell to me and kept me hopping. At the end of the year, my elders recognized that and actually gave me a \$1000 bonus for all the hard work. It could have been a buck. Seeing that they recognized it was priceless and felt incredibly affirming.
- Smaller core group still attending all worship services and events, short on older volunteers, giving has been sporadic lower averages but then they make up for it normally at the end of the month).
- Eviscerated, killed morale, clouded judgment.
- Absent members, service fatigue.
- We're online, giving down a little, personal study & connection is more meaningful.
 People seem disconnected. Online has given us a wider reach; more spiritually focused events versus socially focused.
- Still worshipping on-line (attendance hard to know); giving steady; ministry "reimagined" in many ways.
- Ministry had to pivot; I feel disconnected from congregation regardless of FaceTime or meet with masks.
- Very little change. We have a drive up service using a transmitter to broadcast to vehicles. Everyone is safe and can see and fellowship from their vehicles.
- Some have chosen not to come back for now; limited activity.
- Lower attendance (85 combined in-person + online rather than 125), greatly reduced activity, giving has held steady. My ministry focused much more on administration & COVID response than before (with less time/opportunity now for counseling & Bible studies with individuals).
- Attendance down 50-70%; activity with far fewer fellowship opportunities; Giving stayed the same. Ministry in trying to keep in-touch with members who are not coming has proven to be overwhelming.
- 1/3 down, 1/3, up, frustrating and depressing; greatly damaged our sense of action and vision.
- It has been a roller coaster, attendance, levels of activity, and ministry up and down, but giving steady.
- Difficult, Prayerful, Resourceful, Triumphant, Blessed.
- Attendance down, less event participation, giving stabilized, people are more vocal in their criticism.

- Attendance is difficult to track. Giving has been steady or increased. My ministry has
 changed drastically, but we've engaged with families who are ready in the ways they are
 able to engage.
- 17% decrease in 2020 giving; frustrating in that no one wanted to do online classes, prayer, etc.; shows how we have way too much focus on Sunday mornings. I hate election years and this one was the worst.
- Strengths have become stronger and weaknesses have been exposed.
- Attendance cut 50%, activity has been cut significantly. Giving is close to the same. My ministry has been greatly impacted hardly any visiting or fellowship, a lot of work online (filming, editing, uploading, etc.).
- Presently there is no assembly. Contribution is up. Little personal contact, but daily email & Facebook. Weekly sermon video. No hospital chaplaincy.
